# Overview of Netball Singapore

---

Netball Singapore (NS) is a registered Charity and Institute of Public Character (IPC), governed by the Constitution. It is supported by Sport Singapore and duly approved by the Registry of Societies.

NS was registered as a society with the Registrar of Societies on 5<sup>th</sup> October 1963 and has been registered as a charity under the Charities Act (Chapter 37) since 4<sup>th</sup> October 2010. NS' IPC (Institution of a Public Character) status was renewed from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2024 to 15<sup>th</sup> April 2027.

NS is an Ordinary Member of the Singapore National Olympic Council and World Netball.

# Welcome Message from the President

---

Netball Singapore is pleased to present this Annual Report to our members for the year 1<sup>st</sup> April 2023 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2024.

Netball Singapore saw a major change in the composition of the Board as the new Constitution came into force. Jessica Tan, President since 2012, had reached the end of the allowed tenure, as did 4 other long serving Board Members. The Board saw 5 new members join the team in 2023, to complement the 5 existing Board members who had come on Board in 2021.

Singapore won the Mirxes Nations Cup in 2023 after 16 years. There has been much work put in to develop our age groups and to keep growing the pipeline of talented players for the national squad. The national squad selected in March 2023 is the youngest on record with an average age of 23.1 years.

Singapore competed in the Netball World Cup in Cape Town, S. Africa from 28<sup>th</sup> July to 6<sup>th</sup> August, finishing a creditable 15<sup>th</sup>.

The Deloitte Netball Super League (DNSL) held in March 2024 was one of the most competitive ones to date. The Elite Youth Development scheme in the DNSL is showing promising results, with many young players getting into the opens squad.

Netball Singapore welcomed Mirxes as our new major sponsor in 2023. Mirxes was named the title sponsor of the Mirxes Nations Cup 2023, as well as the Mirxes National League 2023. They continue to be our major sponsor in 2024.

Two of our senior umpires were appointed as Cadet ITPs (International Testing Panel). This was a first for Singapore. They are the first 2 Asians to be appointed to this top body of umpire panelists.

In August 2024, Netball Singapore was proud to announce that Ms. Jane Ittogi had accepted our invitation to be our Patron. Ms. Ittogi then unveiled the new name and logo for the Singapore National Team – the Singapore Vandas,

We look forward to further growing netball in 2024 and beyond, together with you.

Wishing all netballers, fans and friends of Netball in Singapore many more years of enjoying the sport that we all love.

## Summary Financial Performance

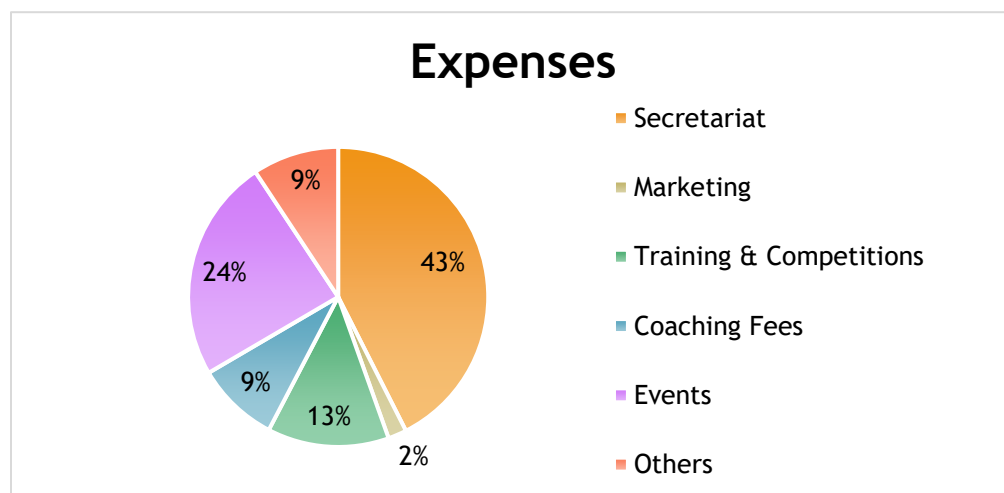
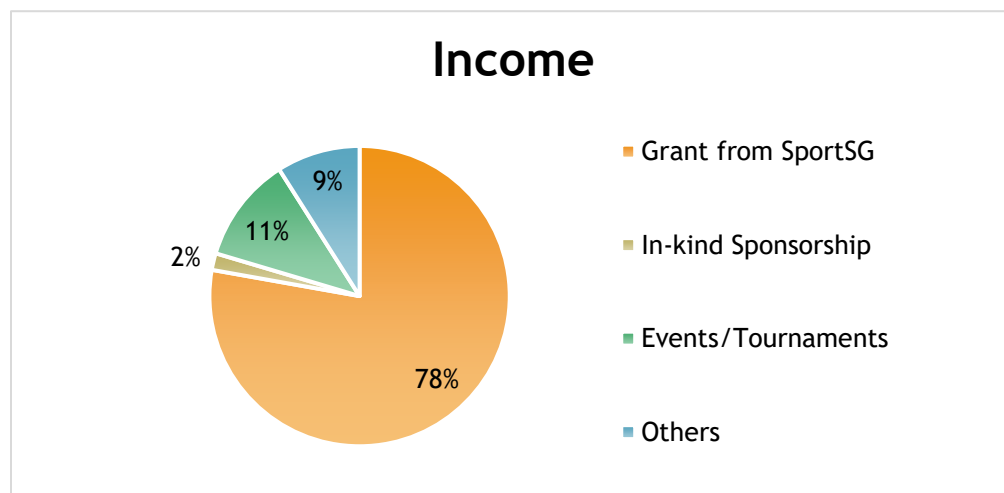
Total Income: \$2,276,278

Total Expenditure: \$2,205,590

Net Surplus Income for the year amounted to \$70,688.

Donations decreased by \$2,850 in the financial year, mainly due to new individual donors.

Expenses decreased by \$2,696,068 in the financial year is mainly due to absence of Asian Netball Championships (held every two years) and Netball Super League (incurred after year-end).

# Significant Milestones

## Our Work: Programmes and Activities

---

### HIGH PERFORMANCE

At the elite level, Netball Singapore maintains the following squads:

- National Opens
- Development/21&U leading to Singapore A and National 21 & under Teams
- 19 & Under (Schools) and 19& Under (Tertiary) leading to the National 19&U Team
- 17 & Under Zone Squads (North, South, East and West) leading to the National 17&U Team
- 14 & Under Zone Squads (North, South, East and West) leading to the National 14&U Team
- 12&Under Zone Squads – (North, South, East and West)

The 19 & Under (Schools), 17 & Under and 14 & Under Zone and National squads are run in close collaboration with the Physical Sport and Outdoor Exercise Branch (PSOEB) of the MOE.

#### a) **National Opens Squad**

A squad of 16 players were selected from the NSL held February - March 2023, of which 2 players were 21&U.

As a buildup and selection for the Netball World Cup (NWC) and Mirxes Nations Cup, the Pacific Aus Series (April) and a pre-NWC tour to Johannesburg (SA) were used as preparation.

At the pinnacle event of netball, the Opens side was the youngest team to compete at the 2023 Netball World Cup (Cape Town). Improving on a finish of 15<sup>th</sup> (2019 16<sup>th</sup>), in beating Sri Lanka twice, despite the unfortunate loss off a key player (Yew Shu Ning – ACL) during the playoffs for 15/16 and two narrow losses to Trinidad & Tobago (ranked 11) 36-49 and Barbados (ranked 14) loss 50-55. Amandeep Kaur and Jamie Lim both were awarded NWC MVPs for matches against Sri Lanka.

The Mirxes Nations Cup in October was a great success with learnings from the NWC. Singapore won the Mirxes Nations Cup after 16 years. Having lost to Papua New Guinea in the round robin, Singapore fought hard in the final to triumph 59-56 in front of a sell-out arena.

#### b) **National A Squad**

The role of the Singapore A Team is to provide a stronger feeder of potential players to the Opens Team by reducing the gap between the starting 7 Opens players and the next level of players.

The squad of 12 players were selected from DNSL, held in February - March 2023, of which 5 players were 21&U. 21&U trials were held soon after with a further 6 players selected for this squad.

The Singapore A team competed strongly in the Nations Cup, with the focus on gaining international experience.

c) **National 21&U Squad**

The National 21&U team had an outstanding campaign at the Asian Youth Championships held in Korea,, with the team taking silver in a very close fought final against Malaysia.

d) **National Age Group Squads**

The move to 4 Zone teams in 2016, from 1 National team, for the 14&U and 17&U squads continues to be successful and has been fundamental in strengthening the national pathway.

The introduction in late 2022 of the 12&U zone programmes to bring in young potential players for the future has also continued to be a very successful initiative.

e) **19 & Under Tertiary & Schools**

The National 19s team had a busy campaign with a tour to Vietnam, the August Malaysia-Singapore Netball Series in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia and the opportunity to play against visiting teams from Philippines and Vietnam.

The 19 & Under Tertiary team (2024) consisted of a total of 14 players selected from a pool of 41 trialists, whilst the 19 & Under Schools team was selected from a pool of 18. Both teams are currently competing in the National League.

f) **17 & Under Zone Age Groups**

The National 17s team who also competed in the Malaysia-Singapore Netball Series in Kuala Lumpur were triumphant over all 3 games. They also had the opportunity to play against visiting teams from Philippines and Vietnam.

The National U17s team (2024) has been selected from a trialist pool of 41 and are currently in training in preparation for the tour to Canberra early Aug.

g) **14 & U Zone Age Groups**

The 14 & Under Zone Teams were selected in October with a year end mini carnival between the zone teams.

A National 14&U team was selected to compete in the Singapore Sports School International Youth Netball Challenge with teams from Hong Kong, Malaysia, South Africa and Singapore. Having a very short lead in time to train the team produced some very good results. Finishing 4<sup>th</sup> overall.

## **TECHNICAL DEVELOPMENT**

a) **Coach Development**

Netball Singapore's NCAP programmes continued to be well supported in 2023.

The first component of the inaugural Level 2 (Advanced) Coaching Course was delivered by Julie Hoornweg, a High Performance Coach Presenter from Australia.

8 coaches attended the course and will continue their Level 2 over a two-year period.

The Mirxes Nations Cup Championships Coaches Seminar was run by Geva Mentor (England Roses National Player and considered the best defender in the world), and Dessi Broughton (Performance Analysis). Total of 73 coaches signed up for the workshops.

The following is a summary of the courses and workshops delivered from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2023 to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2024:

- Two Foundation Coaching courses with a total of 38 participants
- Three Level 1 Coaching Courses with a total of 28 participants completing all requirements.
- One Level 2 coach tested and accredited
- Four Coaches/Teachers Workshop with a total of 32 participants.
- Mirxes Nations Cup Age Group Netball Clinics with a total of 76 players.

#### **b) Bench Officials Appointments**

A 2-day bench course was held in February 2024 with a total of 14 participants and 2 Netball Singapore staff as refresher for the new rules implemented or as first-timer. All participants were required to officiate at least three games during NSL as practice.

We continued to appoint and develop our existing Bench Officials with 3 Bench Officials, being accredited during NSL 2024. 5 Bench Officials were appointed to officiate for Nations Cup in October 2023.

#### **c) Overseas Visiting Teams**

Several overseas teams were hosted by Netball Singapore: Vietnam, Philippines, Hong Kong 21U and Malaysian 21&U teams. The National 17U, National 21U, National 19U and Singapore 17U zones teams played against them giving our young players important regional exposure.

#### **d) Schools Programmes**

##### **ACTIVE School Programme and ACTIVE Carnivals**

In Apr 2023 – Mar 2024, Netball Singapore organised 4 ACTIVE Schools Programmes for students. All 4 were requested from and conducted separately at various schools. A total of 46 participants attended these courses.

#### **a) Teachers**

The Primary School CCA Workshop conducted in 2023 had a total of 13 teachers attending.

The Strengthening Netball Skills Workshop conducted in 2023 had a total of 19 teachers attending.

The Secondary School Manual launch will be on 26 July 2024, Julie Hoornweg will be present for the launch. This will be rolled out to Secondary Schools from

#### **b) ACTIVE Carnivals**

There was no ACTIVE Carnival held in 2023 as the Year End Carnival was held in its place for schools.

## EVENTS

### a) National League 2023

The annual National League for the year 2023 spanned from 29<sup>th</sup> May to 4<sup>th</sup> August with a total of 88 teams taking part. Among these, 77 teams are from Women Open and 11 mixed clubs.

### b) Deloitte Pesta Sukan 2023

The Deloitte Pesta Sukan 2023 was held on a two separate weekends 12<sup>th</sup> August and 19<sup>th</sup> August at Kallang Netball Centre, in conjunction with Get Active Sg organized by Sport Singapore.

A record of 141 teams (2022 was 135 teams) and volunteers came together to participate in the largest and oldest netball carnival in Singapore.

### c) Mixes Nations Cup 2023

The Nation Cup is Netball Singapore's flagship event which is held annually featuring different countries. This year's Nations Cup was held from 22<sup>nd</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> October. Singapore A joined this competition as an invitational team alongside with Team Canada, Cook Islands, Papua New Guinea, Sri Lanka and Singapore.

### d) Year End Carnival (November 2023)

A total of 24 teams participated in the Year End Carnival which was held on 8 November 2023 at Kallang Netball Centre.

### e) Singapore-Malaysia Test Series

The Singapore-Malaysia Test Series was held from 15,17, and 18 February at OCBC Arena and Tampines Hub. Singapore team won all 3 matches against Malaysia.

### f) Deloitte Netball Super League 2024

The annual netball super league came back with international players from Fiji, Cook Islands, Botswana and Papua New Guinea joining us from second round onwards. Started off with Round 1 from 30<sup>th</sup> March – 12<sup>th</sup> May 2024 with the 5 elite local clubs and the selection team, Mannas, the details and results of the whole competition is as per below:

## Net4All

The Net4All programme which started in 2006 continues to be popular with the young working adults. Participants pay a quarterly fee of \$120 or \$50 per month to play/train for 2 hours weekly.

The programme attracted an average of about 40 participants in the intermediate program monthly and 30 participants for the beginner program for the 2023/24 work year.

## Umpires

### a) *Level 1 Umpiring Course*

From April 2023 to March 2024, we held 5 Level 1 Umpiring Courses. All the participants passed their theory tests and most of them passed their Level 1 Umpiring Course.

### b) *Junior Technical Officiating Programme*

MOE and Netball Singapore collaborated to introduce JTOP for Netball from 2023 onwards. It is to equip students with the proper rules and knowledge that will allow them to officiate in intra-school/inter-school events, friendly competition/carnivals confidently. The course will also be a lead-up introduction for students who are interested to sign up for our Level 1 Umpiring course to increase the pool of umpires that will be of help to local competitions' needs.

### c) *Umpiring Appointments – Netball Super League 2024*

Vivian De Silva, Julie Goh, Yu Bee Ling and Joan Yuliani were members of the Umpiring Panel for 2023/24.

Ten umpires were selected into the National Umpire Squad in December 2023 – Two Singapore National Umpires, Seven Advanced and Four Development Squad Members.

A final of 11 umpires were selected for NSL 2024. Refer to **Appendix C** for the full list.

# MARKETING

Netball Singapore's key sponsors for 2023/24 were Deloitte, ASICS, Pacific Sports (Molten), Panyasingha (FBT), Babilou Family Group and Mirxes.

Mirxes was the title sponsor for the National League 2023 and Nations Cup 2023. They will continue to be the title sponsor for the Nations Cup 2024.

Deloitte continue their strong support of Netball Singapore and continue to be the title sponsor of the Deloitte Netball Super League and the Deloitte Pesta Sukan.

The national team has always been the key focus of our campaigns. We have been featuring our national players actively on social media platforms, updating on their international matches more regularly. The team is the face of Netball Singapore. We need to build the fan base of each individual player, especially since it is a relatively young team.

Our posts' reach and engagements are mostly organic. However, prior and during events, we will advertise on social media to try to garner more interest and capture a bigger audience.

To further promote the sport and the national team, the players have also been involved in engagement activities such as sharing and mini training sessions with schools, interviews with bodies such as Tamil Murasu, Straits Times, Channel News Asia and Team Singapore, as well as other initiatives as Team Singapore athletes.

## **1. Community Outreach Programmes**

In partnership with Deloitte, we continued to support the CCA programme for Northlight School for the seventh year and continued to provide them with weekly trainings. The players have since taken part in events such as the Deloitte Pesta Sukan and the Zonal School Games.

As part of our continuous CSR efforts together with Babilou Family Group, netball classes were brought to Pertapis Centre for Women & Girls. Netball Singapore started netball classes for Pertapis in 2021. Initially only 20 students participated in the classes, but this soon grew to about 40 players. NS provides 2 coaches for them. We run 2 classes per week during the school holidays and 1 a week during school term.

## **2. Public Relations and Broadcast**

Netball Singapore received significant media attention in the press and media throughout the year with the following news:

- New Netball Singapore President, Trina Liang
- Singapore National team winning the Mirxes Nations Cup 2023 after a 16-year wait
- Comeback and retirement of Charmaine Soh

There was coverage of Mirxes Nations Cup in most major media outlets such as The Straits Times, Berita Harian, Channel News Asia, MoneyFM, Mothership and MustShareNews. International media coverage was also captured in foreign press.

Other events such as Deloitte Pesta Sukan continued to receive coverage on Straits Times as well.

## FINANCE

A total of S\$504,801 was raised through Netball Singapore's own income sources. This sum consisted of sponsorship in-kind, other Government Grant, income from local tournaments and events, fees from courses and membership.

In summary, the ratio of the funds raised by Netball Singapore S\$504,801 to the Sport Singapore grant FY 2023/24 of S\$1,771,478 was S\$0.28 to \$1 of the Sport Singapore grant. (In FY 2022/23 it was S\$1.24 due to absence of major event in FY 2023/2024).

## The Year Ahead

---

### Charity's Future Plans

Netball Singapore will continue to focus on Elite Development (Opens and all age Groups), Technical Development in coaching and umpiring, Club and Schools growth and development, providing more opportunities for competitive mass participation, growing our Fan Base and bringing exciting netball to Singapore.

We will also continue to engage and expand the netball fraternity through community activities and possible tie-ups with other government agencies.

We will continue to give back to society by sponsoring the coaches for Northlight School and Pertapis.

### Charity's Commitments

Netball Singapore will continue to focus on its key priorities of promoting and growing the sport in Singapore and to providing an affordable and all-inclusive sport to be enjoyed by all.

### IPC's Fund-Raising Plans

Netball Singapore continues to engage potential sponsors for our sport and to continue to refresh our events to attract more teams to participate. We run 7 events in a normal year, and host the Nations Cup each normal year, which is a ticketed event.

### IPC's Expenditure Plans

Netball Singapore has no major expenditure plans for 2024/25.

Netball Singapore continues to be the secretariat of the Asian Netball Federation, and the main resource centre for Asia.

# Governance

---

## Role of the Governing Board

The Board's role is to provide strategic direction and oversight of Netball Singapore's programmes and objectives, as well as to steer the charity towards fulfilling its vision and mission through good governance. As part of its role, the following matters require the Board's approval:

- Approve budget for the financial year and monitor expenditure against budget.
- Review and approve monthly financial statements.
- Regularly monitor the progress of the charity's programmes.
- to appoint sub-committees to assist the Board in carrying out the objects of the Association.<sup>1</sup>
- to consider applications for membership.
- to approve expenditure and other business of the Association.
- to decide on appeals against any decisions of any sub-committee set up to deal with disciplinary matters.
- to do all other acts as are consistent with the objects and interests of the Association.

## Appointment and Term Limit of Board

All elected members of the Board shall hold office for a term of 4 years. A retiring member of the Board shall be eligible for re-election at the meeting in which she/he retires. The Board will have an accumulative term limit of 8 years, which will commence from 2023, as the new constitution was only implemented in 2021. The Treasurer has a term limit of 4 years.

The previous constitution stated that an individual may be elected to serve as the President for a maximum accumulative tenure of 12 years excluding the Non-President Tenure of such individual, subject to a maximum tenure of 16 years in total. Jessica Tan – Board Member from 2007 to 2012 & President from 2012 to current. We are transitioning to the new constitution in 2023.

## Board Meetings and Attendance

The current Board was elected at the 1<sup>st</sup> Meeting on 27<sup>th</sup> September 2023 after AGM. A total of 4 Board meetings were held till the end of financial year. The AC also reviewed the financial statements of the charity and the auditor's report for the financial year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March 2024.

During FY2023, Value in Kind of S\$131,906 (see Appendix C) was received from sponsors as compared to \$2,108,092 in FY2022. This amount has been included in the total operating expenditure of \$2,205,590 (FY2022: \$4,901,658). The lower amount of Value in Kind received was primarily due to the absence of Asian Netball Championships which was held every two years.

The reserves that have been set aside provide financial stability and the means for the development of the Association's activities. NS intends to maintain its reserves level of at least 30% to 40% of Annual Operating Expenditure to meet any short- to medium-term eventualities.

Netball Singapore has no plans to use the reserves in the foreseeable future.

### Conflict of Interest

Board members and Secretariat staff are expected to avoid actual and perceived conflicts of interest.
